English runners take part in the Bocholt City Run for the first time

The Bocholt city run inspires even the English twin town of Rossendale: for the first time this year, 12 runners from "Rossendale Harriers and Athletics" came to Bocholt as guests of Sportfreunde 97/30 Lowick e.V..
